MONDAY	<p>We will share a Literacy and Numeracy activity to do on the class dojo story each day. Please take lots of photos to upload on class dojo or Tapestry.</p> <p>(We will be using class dojo to provide you with activities to do at home, please feel free to message us photos of your child's work or what they have been up to, however please note we will not be using this as a messaging service.)</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>RE Easter ideas:</u></p> <p>Talk about Easter with your child and explore some of the information and resources on the BBC website. There are also some suitable videos on YouTube which tell the story of Easter.</p> <p>Ask your child these key questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What is love? • Where is love? • Who do you love? • Who loves you? • How do you/they show that love? • How did Jesus show that he loved us? <p>Think about Jesus' time praying in Gethsemane and see if you can write your own prayers thanking God for the people who love you and for his love for us.</p> <p>Talk about the emotions in the story. Why do they like that colour? Write down their answer. Draw and colour something that they love in their favourite colour.</p>	<p>Draw a self-portrait and shade or colour it in.</p>
